

The Power Cost Adjustment has been reinstated

Beginning with the January 2018 bill, there will be a Power Cost Adjustment (PCA) of .5 cents (\$0.005) added as a separate line item on your GELD electric bill.

The PCA is a way for Groton Electric to recoup the increased generation costs associated with higher fuel prices and power costs. For the winter of 2018 the PCA will be a ½ cent/kilowatt-hour on the January, February and March bills. One of the reasons for this cost increase is that New England has inadequate natural gas pipeline infrastructure. About 10 weeks out of the year, the two pipelines that enter New England from the west are full and cannot transport enough fuel for the electric generating plants, so electricity must be generated using diesel fuel which is substantially more expensive.
